Telling Sentences

A **telling sentence** tells about something or someone. It begins with a capital letter. It usually ends with a **period (.)**. A telling sentence that shows strong feeling may end with an **exclamation point (!)**.

The cat sat on the mat.
Sam is mad!

An asking sentence asks about something or someone. It begins with a capital letter. It ends with a question mark (?).

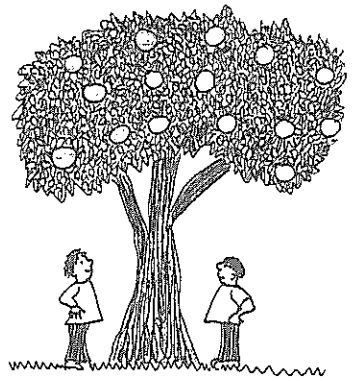

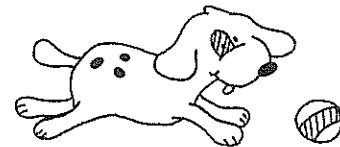
