Active and Passive Verbs

Active verb

A verb that is used if the subject does the action.

Use an **active verb** if the subject is doing the action. The sentence tells who did what.

EXAMPLE

Carlos wrote a story.

Passive verb

A verb that is used when the action happens to the subject. Use a **passive verb** if the action happens to the subject. The sentence tells what was done by whom.

EXAMPLE

The story was written by Carlos.

To form the passive verb, use the helping verb *be* with the past participle (the third part of the verb).

EXAMPLE

Correct: The story was written by Carlos.

Incorrect: The story was wrote by Carlos.

In some sentences that use passive voice, the person doing the action is not named. The person is "understood."

EXAMMINES

Today the bank was robbed. (by someone)

The pass was thrown well. (by someone)
